"TOGETHER"

(Matthew 26:17-35)

On this Palm Sunday, we will celebrate the Lord's Supper together. In our spiritual preparations for the observance, we will begin today with the message. Prepare your hearts for this special day.

"Let a person examine himself, then, and so eat of the bread and drink of the cup. For anyone who eats and drinks without discerning the body eats and drinks judgment on himself" (1 Corinthians 11:28-29, ESV).

Why do we need spiritual preparation for the Lord's Supper?

Paul wrote to Timothy, "But understand this, that in the last days there will come times of difficulty. For people will be lovers of self, lovers of money, proud, arrogant, abusive, disobedient to their parents, ungrateful, unholy, heartless, unappeasable, slanderous, without self-control, brutal, not loving good,

treacherous, reckless, swollen with conceit, lovers of pleasure rather than lovers of God, having the appearance of godliness, but denying its power. Avoid such people" (2 Timothy 3:1-5, ESV).
