“THE POWER OF PRAYER”

(Acts 12:1-16)

Prayer is a great mystery to most people. Does it really work? Does it make a difference? Why does a faithful prayer life come with such difficulty for us? Today we'll walk through a Bible story about prayer that weaves through our pressings questions.

“The prayer of a righteous person is very powerful in its effect. Elijah was a human being as we are, and he prayed earnestly that it would not rain, and for three years and six months it did not rain on the land. Then he prayed again, and the sky gave rain and the land produced its fruit” (James 5:16-18, CSB).

“And this is the confidence that we have toward him, that if we ask anything according to his will he hears us. And if we know that he hears us in whatever we ask, we know that we have the requests that we have asked of him” (1 John 5:14-15, ESV).

“Praying at all times in the Spirit, with all prayer and supplication. To that end, keep alert with all perseverance, making supplication for all the saints” (Ephesians 6:18, ESV).
